## GENERAL INFORMATION

Exhibitors should familiarize themselves with the following rules and regulations, as they will be enforced. Anyone exhibiting at the 2026 Weyburn Agricultural Society Exhibition is subject to these rules and regulations and any violation of the same will subject exhibitors to be penalized at the discretion of the committee in charge. The show committee reserves the right to decide any point not covered by the rules and regulations and to correct any error and to make any alterations to the rules, prize list, program, and schedule.

### **Camping**

All camper parking must be registered at the show office prior to the exhibition. Space allotted on a first come basis. All camping fees must be paid in full before you are allowed to park in the camping area. Trailers will be parked at the owner's risk.

### **Exhibitor Parking**

All vehicles must be parked in designated parking areas. Vehicles are not allowed to park around the barn area, except for unloading and loading of livestock. Vehicles are allowed on the grounds before 8:00 am and after 7:00 pm only. Any vehicle parked in a no parking area will be towed at the owner's expense.

### **Entries**

Entry deadlines are noted under each section and must reach the show office by the date specified. Entries will not be accepted after the entry deadline. Entries must be accompanied by the applicable fees payable to the Weyburn Agricultural Society. In all cases the right is reserved to reject entirely or accept conditionally any entry. Exhibits that have been incorrectly entered will be transferred to their proper classes prior to judging. All entries must be on printed forms supplied for that purpose. No post-dated cheques will be accepted. **There will be no refund of entry fees.**

### **Fraud**

Upon discovery of fraud, deception, or dishonest practice, either in the preparation of ownership or of misrepresentation concerning exhibits which may have been affected or been intended to affect the decision of the judge, the Society will withhold the award and may prohibit such parties from exhibiting in any class.

### **Judging**

The decision of the judge shall be final, and no protest or appeal will be considered except in cases where misrepresentation or fraud is alleged. In the absence of competition, the judge shall award only such premium as they feel the entry merits.

### **Chutes**

No chutes will be allowed in the barns.

## **Protests**

An exhibitor lodging a protest must make it in writing and present it to the committee chairman in charge within 12 hours following the protest. The protest must state plainly the cause of complaint or appeal and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$25.00, which sum shall be forfeited to the Society.

## **Pets**

Due to health and safety issues no pets are allowed on the grounds. **NO DOGS** will be tolerated on the exhibition grounds for **ANY REASON.**

## **Zero Tolerance Policy**

Abuse of our volunteers WILL NOT be tolerated. The FAMILY that is involved will have to forfeit prize money if abuse continues. The abuse of our office and volunteers has cost us volunteers and this is no longer tolerated on ANY level.

## **Liability**

No claim for injury to any person or property shall ever be asserted nor suit instituted or maintained against the Society, its officers, or agents, by or on behalf on any visitor or person, firm or corporation, or their agents, representatives or employees having license or privilege to exhibit in the exhibition or occupying space therein. All exhibits shall be under the control and discretion of the Weyburn Agricultural Society, but solely at the risk of the exhibitor. The Weyburn Agricultural Society will not be responsible for damage, injury, loss, or theft. Each exhibitor will be solely responsible for any article exhibited by him/her, and for its description as given in the entry, and shall indemnify the Weyburn Agricultural Society against legal or other proceedings in regard thereto.

Exhibitors of animals, machinery in motion and other exhibits liable to occasion accidents, injury or damage to persons coming into contact with them, shall guard their exhibits and protect the public from coming in contact therewith, and every such exhibitor shall indemnify the Society from and against all claims demands, by reason of any accident or of any person being injured or suffering damage or by any reason of such exhibit not being properly guarded or the public not being protected there from.

The Society reserves the right to remove from the grounds any exhibit, animal, stand or show that may be falsely entered, or may be deemed unsuitable or objectionable, without assigning a reason.

## **Tampering of Livestock**

Unethical fitting of cattle entered for competition is prohibited. All cattle entered for competition shall be presented in the judging ring in their natural state with no preparation other than natural feeding and fitting except for any treatment of hair, horns, and hooves. No hair or other foreign material may be artificially attached to the animal, except false switches. For this show, unethical fittings will be deemed to consist of any treatment or operation materially altering the structure or the natural confirmation of any part of the animal's body, surgical operation to exaggerate the natural conformation of the animal. Artificial coloring of hair is prohibited. Any animal which, in the opinion of the committee, has been unethically fitted shall be disqualified from the exhibition and shall forfeit the right to be awarded any prizes and the entry fee shall be forfeited.

## **Stalling**

1. There will be no barn space provided for Sunday June 29<sup>th</sup>, 2026. Horses will be shown from trailers.

## **Show**

1. Show time is 9:00 a.m., Sunday, June 28<sup>th</sup>, 2026, in the arena.
2. Chains or halter shanks in showmanship classes are allowed.
3. Junior and Cloverbuds will be permitted to use 2 hands on their reins if they desire.
4. Snaffle bits are acceptable.
5. No tie downs or martingales unless in timed events.

## **Judging**

1. Judge's decision is final.
2. Any 4-H member lodging a protest must make it in writing and must deliver it to the show office before 10:00 am the day following the show. The cause of which complaint or appeal must be accompanied with a deposit of \$25.00 which shall be forfeited.
3. S.H.F. (Saskatchewan Horse Federation) rules will apply unless otherwise stated.

## **High Point**

1. Points for High Point Award shall be the total points earned throughout the day.
2. If a person rides 2 horses, they must designate, **at the time of entry**, which horse they will use for High Point Trophy.
3. In the event of a tie there will be a ride off.

## **Prize Money**

1<sup>st</sup> 40% 2<sup>nd</sup> 30% 3<sup>rd</sup> 20% 4<sup>th</sup> 10% of entries

## **Liability**

1. All stock and equipment are at the owner's risk in case of damage by fire or otherwise.
2. Owner assumes own attendant's liability in cases of injury or death.
3. Humane treatment of livestock is always required.
4. All veterinary fees are the responsibility of the exhibitor.
5. Helmets with a strap are mandatory. (CSA Approved)
6. Western attire only – boots, jeans, and long-sleeved shirt.

## 84<sup>th</sup> ANNUAL 4-H INTER-CLUB SHOW & SALE

**Entry deadline: June 15, 2026**

**Entry Fee: \$25.00 per head**

### Rules and Regulations:

1. Competition restricted to members of District #7 4-H clubs or to clubs from other districts which have applied in writing to and been granted permission by the Society to have this serve as their Regional Show.
2. Animals with horns must not be shown, heifer project excluded.
3. Entries in this division are open to 4-H clubs, only.
4. The owner is responsible for exhibits. All stock and equipment are at owner's risk.
5. The Society is not responsible for transportation or veterinary fees.
6. Entry forms must be submitted by leaders and corrections to the entries will be the responsibility of the 4-H club leader.
7. Each club supplies their own bedding and feed.
8. All animals must have suitable neck ropes and halters.
9. The Ag Society is collecting a 2% check off for building and grounds upgrades.
10. All electrical cords must have three prongs.
11. Show numbers must be worn by all exhibitors.
12. All animals must be on the grounds by 8:00 am, Monday June 29<sup>th</sup>, 2026.
13. Animals will be weighed at 8:00 am, Monday, June 29<sup>h</sup>, 2026. Any exhibitor who is not present for weighing with their club will weigh after all clubs.
14. All weights will be final unless altered by the committee. Committee decision is final.
15. All calves must be put through the ring and sold by auction to the highest bidder. All club animals will be sold by the Society and proceeds, less 2% commission and brand inspection fee, remitted to the clubs.
16. On sale day, each club is responsible to designate 2 people to be on grounds to assist with the loading of animals until all club calves have left the grounds. Suitable halters must be left with steers after the sale. Each club is responsible for the paperwork for the removal of all animals.
17. Exhibits must not be dismantled until all the calves have been sold.
18. No trailers are allowed to be parked on the grounds during the fair.
19. No trucks or trailers are allowed around the barn area until all the calves have been sold.
20. Grooming of the 4-H animals is the responsibility of the registered 4-H members or members of the clubs attending the Weyburn Regional 4-H Show. **WARNING: Any member having out of regional help with fitting will be disqualified from the Regional Show and Sale.**
21. All stalls must be cleaned by 7:00 am each day.
22. No pictures with buyers should be taken until the sale is completely over.
23. All leaders are considered members of this committee.
24. **No Keg party or any other party will be allowed on Ag. Society property, failure to follow this rule could lead to charges and disqualification from the sale.**
25. **Absolutely no chutes will be allowed in the barns.**
26. **\*\*\*All Steers MUST show in their appropriate weight class to be eligible to sell.\*\*\***
27. If members are wishing to donate all or part of calf proceeds, they must complete an agreement with the Weyburn Agricultural Society.
28. Any donated back steers will move to the end of the sale to be re-sold.
29. Best Home-Grown Steer will sell third in sale order if it isn't Grand or Reserve Grand Champion.
30. Cloverbuds are allowed to move up to the junior division for team grooming in their own club if the club is short a member in that division. If you don't have a full team, please submit your entries to the office. The committee will pick someone from the 4<sup>th</sup> place finishes of other clubs to complete your team.
31. No grafted calves allowed on a cow/calf continuation project.
32. During 4-H Judging Classes, no cell phones or outside notes are allowed.
33. Market Lambs are encouraged to be over 90lbs. They must be slick shorn no more than ¼ inch of wool.
